Notice of Proposed Sole Source Purchase

Mississippi State University anticipates purchasing the item(s) listed below as a sole source purchase. Anyone objecting to this purchase shall follow the procedures outlined below.

1. Commodity or commodities to be purchased (make, model, description):

S&P ExecuComp Data MI Feeds/API-Textuals/Professionals and Relationships Professional Data: Internal

2. Explanation of the need to be fulfilled by this item(s), how is it unique from all other options, and why it is the only one that can meet the specific needs of the department:

There is no other database that contains annual executive compensation data at the executive level.

3. Name of company/individual selling the item and why that source is the only possible source that can provide the required item(s):

S&P Global Market Intelligence, Inc.

4. Estimated cost of item(s) and an explanation why the amount to be expended is considered reasonable:

Annual Rate 2025 -2026 is \$6,551.00. Cost is considered reasonable because it will be shared with another unit in the College of Business.

5. Explanation of the efforts taken by the department to determine this is the only source and the efforts used to obtain the best possible price:

We have done a thorough search to determine that the data is not available from any other source. We initially purchased this product in 2012 and have used it since that time. We plan to continue using it in the future.

Subject Line must read "Sole Source Objection"

The notice shall contain a detailed explanation of why the commodity is not a sole source procurement. Appropriate documentation shall also be submitted if applicable.

If after a review of the submitted notice and documents, MSU determines that the commodity in the proposed sole source request can be provided by another person or entity, then MSU will withdraw the sole source request publication from the procurement portal website and submit the procurement of the commodity to an advertised competitive bid or selection process.

If MSU determines after review that there is only one (1) source for the required commodity, then MSU will appeal to the Public Procurement Review Board. MSU will have the burden of proving that the commodity is only provided by one (1) source.
